I. Introduction to Missional Discipleship

Fans of Jesus or followers of Jesus?

- Fans are passive and uninvested
- Followers are actively engaged

Mark 1:14-20

- "Come, follow me" = The call to <u>discipleship</u>
- "I'll make you fishers of men" = The call to mission

II. Missional Discipleship is the tool Jesus uses to grow and multiply His Kingdom

Relationship between mission and discipleship

- Discipleship leads into mission with Jesus
- Mission creates opportunities to be discipled by Jesus
- Mission and Discipleship are two sides of the same coin!

We can't afford to focus solely on discipleship or mission, while neglecting the other...

- Focusing only on Discipleship leads to Elitism

Elitism equates following Jesus to being 'right'

- We begin to believe that we are overqualified or underqualified
- Leaves us proud or disheartened
- Focusing only on Mission leads to Consumerism

Consumerism equates following Jesus to the 'brand'

- We begin to believe that it's all about results and numbers
- Leaves us superficial and empty

WE MUST BE FAITHFUL TO BOTH MISSION AND DISCIPLESHIP

- We need to go from being people who happen to be Christians, to being Christians who happen to be people...
