- 1) Read Matthew 28:16-20. Based on this passage (and other Scripture that comes to mind), what does it mean to be a disciple of Jesus?

- 2) Read Ephesians 2:4-9 and Philippians 1:6. Why is it important to know the Gospel of Jesus Christ is both saving and sanctifying news?

- 3) Building on question #2, why is important to know that justification and sanctification are both gifts of the Gospel?

- 4) Sanctification, the process of being sanctified, being transformed, the life of Jesus Christ being formed in me (Galatians 2:20) is something being done to us, yet we have agency as well.

How do we sift through the reality that sanctification is a gift of God but also a duty of ours? (If time, read Heb. 12:1-3, Col. 2:6-7, Eph. 4:1-3; further reading, Col. 3)

- 5) What does God use to form the life of Jesus in us? Where do you feel God is inviting you to go deeper?

- 6) Removing the words “to obey” from the Great Commission has been called “the great omission”. Why do you think it is important to not forget those words in Jesus’ mandate for us to make disciples and also in our lives?

- 7) How would you appreciate others joining with you in prayer this week?

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
