## I. What God will do (v. 6)

- A. Salvation's Present Trials with the lens of what God will do...
  - Proves our circumstances are best understood in light of our Eternal Inheritance,
     what God will do; it is as good as done
  - 2. "In this..."

Eternal Inheritance (imperishable, undefiled, unfading) is coupled with Joy

3. "rejoice..."

Joy is coupled with our Present Trials

- 4. "grieved by various trials"
- There will be seasons in life when you lack provision, power, position, protection, and a sense of permanence.
- At times you will become the recipient of verbal or physical persecutions that arise on account of the Word.
- This includes the pain experienced by those who have loved ones whose bodies appear to be wasting away before their very eyes.
- This includes the dark moments in life when we are asked to fend off the prowling attacks of Satan.

- A. Salvation's Present Trials with the lens of what God is doing... (v. 7-9)
  - 1. Proves the genuineness of our faith
  - 2. Genuine Faith is:
    - a) Tested
    - b) Refined (Romans 14:23, removing sin—where we put faith in ourselves)
    - c) More Precious than Gold (God's economy = Genuine Faith > Gold)

- 3. Genuine Faith is marked by:
  - a) Continual Belief (Trust, Put One's Confidence in)
  - b) Continual Faith in what is unseen (Hebrews 11:1)
  - c) Continual Rejoicing with an inexpressible joy

GOSPEL TRANSFORMATION and REAL LIFE is continual growth toward maturity in CHRIST.

## III. What God has done (v. 10-12)

- A. Salvation's Present Trials with the lens of what God has done...
  - 1. Proves God's love for us and gives a fuller and bigger picture that we are a part of something bigger than ourselves
  - 2. Encouragement from Prophets
  - 3. Encouragement from Preachers
  - 4. Encouragement from Angels

What God has done, What God is doing, What God will do

—these are the lenses to see our circumstances; for Jesus is the same yesterday, today, and forever (Hebrews 13:8).
