I. Into the Wild

A. Background (Exodus 3-24)

- -Moses sent to deliver Israel from slavery (Ex 3-6)
- -The Ten Plagues on Egypt (Ex 7-12)
- -The Exodus Begins (Ex 13)
- -The Crossing of the Red Sea (Ex 14)
- -The Israelites at Mount Sinai (Ex 19)
- -Moses Receives the Commandments (Ex 20)
- -Moses receives the Law (Ex 21-24)

B. Bitter Water (Exodus 15:22-23)

- 1. Then Moses "made"
- 2. The Wilderness of Shur
- 3. Three Days without water

C. Grumbling and Crying (vs 24-25a)

- 1. What shall we drink?!
- 2. And he cried to the Lord and the Lord showed him a tree

D. A Tree and a Test (vs 25b-27)

- 1. A statute, a rule, and a test
- 2. Listen to the voice of the Lord, and do what is right
 - -give ear to his commandments and keep his statutes
- 3. I will put none of the diseases on you, for I am the Lord, your healer

II. Hello my name is...

Scripture uses many names FOR God in order to describe the many different attributes OF God. With each name comes a more complete picture of:

-His nature

-His promises

-His person

A. His Name... Yahweh Ropheka

- -"I Am the Lord your Healer"
- -God wants His people to learn that He is their healer

B. His Nature (Psalm 147:2-6)

- -God leads his people through desert experiences to build them up
- -It's in his nature to heal the brokenhearted and bind their wounds

C. His Promise

- 1. Hear my word; and do what it says
 - -Diligently listen to the voice of God and do what is right in his sight
 - -Give ear to his commandments and keep his statutes
- 2. I WILL...

"I will put none of the diseases on you that I put on the Egyptians, ...for I am the Lord, your healer."

D. His Person

THE TREE THAT WAS THROWN INTO THE WATERS OF MARAH POINT FORWARD TO ANOTHER TREE THAT WAS HUNG ON THE HILL OF GOLGOTHA

- 1. Jesus, the Great Physician.
 - a. Who brings forgives that heals our bitterness
 - b. Who establishes a new covenant through his blood
 - c. Who proclaims (Lk 4:18-19)
 - -Good news to the poor
 - -Liberty to the captives
 - -Sight to the blind
 - -Liberty to the oppressed
 - -The year of the Lord's favor upon us
 - d. Who came not for the well, but for us who were sick (Luke 5:27-31)

III. Our Response

- A. Is to Jesus, in light of the cross
- B. Is by faith, through the act of obedience
- C. Is from the heart, at work in our lives
