3. One Peace — that's the particular emphasis in this section. How do see that theme in this passage? What is peace? Why do you think real peace is only and always an outcome of the gospel?

#### Philippians 1:18

"What then? Only that in every way, whether in pretense or in truth,

Christ is proclaimed; and in this I rejoice."

Oneness in the church is a big deal. Jesus prayed for us — that we would be one, so that people would believe that He is the Savior of the world. That's a big deal!

The gospel is the message of salvation. The gospel creates oneness in the church. And then our oneness adorns the gospel. Our oneness makes the gospel fragrant and attractive to people. People are drawn to the oneness we have with God, and with one another, because they too were created in the image of God for that same oneness. It's a deep longing of the human heart. We were made for oneness.

The oneness described in the book of Philippians does not exist apart from Jesus. Apart from Jesus, among people in the world there can be togetherness, cooperation, teamwork, harmony — things like that. But oneness is different. As we'll see in Philippians, it's a gift from God. It comes to us in the gospel. It's a real miracle. It's part of the great adventure we are made for.

# Helpful Background to Philippians

## What was Philippi like?

- The city's original name was Crenides "the little fountains"
- In 356 B.C. Philip II of Macedonia seized, enlarged and fortified the city, and renamed it Philippi ("pertaining to Philip") in, you guessed it, his own honor
- Philippi was an inland city on the famous Roman highway; it was an important for both commerce and culture
- The Romans conquered Philippi in 168 B.C. and made it a Roman colony
- By the time of Paul's journeys on mission to Philippi, the people had become very proud of their Roman citizenship
- Today Philippi is in ruins

# One Church — One Citizenship

#### Philippians 3:15-21 Discussion Questions

1. Really read Philippians 3:15-21. What do you learn and see? What stands out most to you?

2. Philippians is full of Jesus. His names or designations — Jesus, Christ, Lord, Savior, along with the personal pronouns (He, Him, Himself) — are used over 90 times in Philippians. What does this section teach you about Jesus — Who He is and what He means to the church and to you?

3. One Citizenship — that's the particular emphasis in this section. How do see that theme in this passage? What might change in your attitudes and actions if you really lived as if heaven, and not earth, were your true home?

#### How did the Church in Philippi begin? What was it like?

- The church was planted as a direct result of Paul and his companions' (Luke and Silas) sharing the gospel in Philippi, having been sent there by a heavenly vision (Acts 16:6-10)
- A number of people heard and responded to the gospel. As the gospel's influence began to impact the commerce and culture of Philippi, Paul and Silas were forced to leave, but Luke stayed to nurture the young church (for a more complete picture, read Acts 16)
- Paul returned to Philippi about 5 years later for a short visit
- Paul was eventually placed in house arrest in Rome (Acts 28), and around 62-63 A.D. he wrote the letter (that we know as the book of Philippians) to the church
- A church leader in Philippi, Epaphroditus, had taken a substantial financial gift from the church to Paul in Rome, and then returned with Paul's letter
- The church would have been about 10 years old when they received Paul's letter
- Two characteristics stand out about the church: they were predominantly a Gentile church, and they were an incredibly generous church
