

CITIZEN-SAINTS

"but our citizenship is in heaven, and we eagerly wait for a Savior from there, the Lord Jesus Christ." -Phil 3:20

I. HOW DOES GOD FORM US AS SAINTS?

(Luke 18:9-14)

- A. What we thought about Saints:
 - 1. Dead and Gone
 - 2. Always Singled Out
 - 3. Worshipped Over
 - 4. Recognized by the Church
 - 5. Made Holy by Good Works

SELF-RIGHTEOUSNESS IS NEVER IN CORRELATION TO GOD, BUT ALWAYS IN COMPARISON TO OTHERS.

B. Who God says Saints are:

- 1. Alive and Present (Phil 1:1)
- 2. Always Plural (Rom 16:15)
- 3. Worship God (Eph 1:1)
- 4. Righteous Through the Life, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ (1 Cor 1:2)
- 5. Made Holy by Grace, through Faith (Col 1:12)

II. HOW DOES BEING A SAINT INFORM OUR CITIZENSHIP? (Phil 3:18-20; Eph 2:8-13)

- A. Our salvation is a gift (Eph 2:8-9)
- B. Our work is always in response (Eph 2:10)
- C. Our reconciliation and redemption was needed (Eph 2:12)
- D. Our relationship with God is complete (Eph 2:13)

III. HOW DOES OUR CITIZENSHIP TRANSFORM OUR LIVES?

- 1. In Christ, we are FORMED TOGETHER, In His Kingdom, For His Glory
 - a. Our Righteousness in Christ makes us <u>ALIENS</u> here, but Citizens in His Kingdom

(Hebrews 11:13-16)

- i. New Promise (Heb 11:13)
 - 1. By faith, we live forward with the vision of a new promise of real life in Jesus
- ii. New Place (Heb 11:16a)
 - By faith, we live with hearts of hope desiring a better place in Jesus

- iii. New Preparation (Heb 11:16b)
 - 1. By faith, we live with eternal priorities with the knowledge of an eternal City of God as our homeland.
- b. Our Righteousness in Christ calls us to be <u>AMBASSADORS</u> here, carrying the message of our King, for His glory

(2 Cor 5:16-21)

i. New Ministry

-Ambassadors carry out the ministry of their country to another

ii. New Message

-Ambassadors carry the message of their King to another

OUR MESSAGE IS THE GOSPEL, AND THE GOSPEL ISN'T ADVICE TO BE FOLLOWED; IT IS GOOD NEWS ABOUT WHAT HAS ALREADY BEEN DONE" -Tim Keller

- 2. Living outside of our Citizenship makes us **TOURISTS** rather than **AMBASSADORS** Trying to Live Without Citizenship:
 - a. Makes us <u>SUSPICIOUS</u> of our <u>PRESENT</u>
 - b. Makes us <u>FEARFUL</u> of our <u>FUTURE</u>
- 3. Living as citizens in Christ means we think, look, speak, and act differently
 - a. We forgive because Christ forgave us
 - b. We are generous because Christ is generous
 - c. We live holy because Christ is holy
 - d. We meet people where they are because Christ meets us right where we are
