THE RIPPLE EFFECTS OF THE GOSPEL

I. A World in Need of Changing

- A. **Distanced** from one another
 - -a life at arm's length. controlled, safe, well planned, and carefully executed
- B. Distinguished from one another
 - -a need to be recognized as unique and a little better
- C. **Diplomatic** with one another
 - -a goal of looking benevolent, saying the right thing, while maintaining the status quoshut everyone out, shut everyone down, and shut my mouth

THE EARLY CHURCH WAS BORN INTO WAS A WORLD HELL BENT ON KEEPING THEIR DISTANCE, LOOKING DISTINGUISHED,

AND ACTING DIPLOMATIC. IT WAS A WORLD IN DESPERATE NEED OF CHANGE.

- II. The Transforming Power of God (Ch10:1-34)
- A. A Centurion Called Cornelius... the man without the full story (vs 1-8)
- -a leader worth following, God-fearer known for his generosity, man of prayer and devotion
- **B.** An Apostle Called Peter... saved by grace and always growing (vs 9-20)
 - 1. Peter's Vision
 - "Rise, Peter, Kill and Eat!" -vs 13
 - 2. Peter's Opposition
 - "By no means, Lord; for I have never eaten anything that is common or unclean" -vs 14
 - 3. Peter's Invitation
 - "now while Peter was inwardly perplexed as to what the vision might mean"-vs17

C. 2 Lives Transforming through the Gospel (vs 21-34)

1. Relationally Driven

The Gospel moves Peter from a world of distancing to a life of relationship -"I am the one you're looking for... so he invited them in" vs 21 and 23

2. Incarnationally Modeled

The Gospel moves Peter from a world of trying to look distinguished to a life spent investing incarnationally (God became one of us and lived among us, now we do the same)

-"But Peter lifted him up, saying 'I too am a man'" -vs26

3. Exponentially Advancing

The Gospel moves Peter from a world walking past without saying a word, to opening up his home, his heart, his life, and his mouth

-"So Peter opened his mouth, 'truly, I understand that God shows no partiality"

-vs 34


THE GOSPEL IS RELATIONAL, INCARNATIONAL, AND EXPONENTIAL

III. The Ripple Effects of the Gospel

A. 3 Threads running through the Early Church (Acts 10:34-48)

- 1. The Distillation of the Gospel message (vs 34-43)
 - -Jesus is Lord of all...
 - -living a Perfect Life on Earth -vs 36-39a
 - -crucified, dying a horrible death in our place for our sin -vs39b
 - -rising again, victorious over death, hell, and the grave -vs 40-41
 - -sitting as judge over the living and the dead -vs42
 - -and all who put their faith in Him will be saved -vs43
- 2. The Indwelling of the Holy Spirit (vs 44-46)
 - -opening hearts and changing lives to receive the Gospel
- 3. The Baptism of Believers (vs 47-48)
 - -bearing witness to the power of the gospel at work in their lives

B. Unity in diversity is byproducts of the Gospel (vs 10:45, 11:1-4, 11:18)



C. The Power of God for Salvation to All

- 1. Once Keeping Distant- Now **Brother and Sister in Christ** Ephesians 2:14
- 2. Once wanting to look Distinguished- Now **Co-heirs with Christ** -Romans 8:17
- 3. Once seeming Diplomatic- Now **Ambassadors For Christ** 2 Corinthians 5:20
