## Called to Cultivate

A Foundation for Gospel-Centered Work

## I. The Way We Work

How the Gospel changes how and why we work. (Over the next 6 weeks...)

- 1. The Gospel gives a solid foundation without which work will dislodge us
- 2. The Gospel gives a new identity without which work will define us
- 3. The Gospel gives lasting peace without which work will dominate us
- 4. The Gospel gives clear direction without which work will diminish us
- 5. The Gospel gives proper alignment without which work will divide us
- 6. The Gospel gives an eternal perspective without which work will distress us

## II. Work from the Start

- A. The False Narrative we believe about work says: "WORK IS A CURSE!"
  - -that work is a result of the Fall.
  - -all we were meant for in paradise was laying by the pool, eating grapes, and playing shuffleboard
- B. The Biblical Narrative (Gen 1:1-5; Gen 1:26-28)
  - -in the beginning God created"
  - -then God said "let us make man in our image, after our likeness"
  - -"and God blessed them"
  - -"and God said: be fruitful, multiply, fill the earth, subdue it, have dominion"
- C. The Principle of Stewardship (Gen 2:15)
  - "the Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to work it and keep it"
  - -"To work it": to serve; labor; to cultivate
  - -"To keep it": to protect, treasure
- D. Thistles and Thorns (Gen 3:17-19)
  - -"thorns and thistles it shall bring forth for you; and you shall eat the plants of the field."

WORK... EVEN GOOD HARD WORK...
IS PART OF GOD'S BLESSING NOT HIS CURSE

## III. Called to Cultivate through Thistles and Thorns (Colossians 1:15-23)

- -The Gospel has everything to do with the answer!
- A. Jesus is "the image of the invisible God"
  - -we can know what the invisible God is like through Jesus- the word became flesh- who made his dwelling among us
  - -he was there already present in the beginning
    -all things are by him, through him, for him, and in him

# IT ISN'T OUR WORK ON THIS EARTH THAT RECTIFIES US WITH GOD IT'S JESUS' WORK ON THE CROSS THAT RECONCILES US TO GOD

- B. And This is Our Foundation on which to Build... (vs 21-23)
  - -"continue in the faith":

continue: [epimeno]: epi... fitting, it's an intensifier to the word "meno" meno... stay, remain, live, dwell, ABIDE
-the same word that Jesus uses in John 15

- 1. "Be stable": a descriptor of a foundation that has been laid ahead of you
- 2. "Be steadfast": firm... meaning to be solidly based and well-seated
- 3." Not shifting": not being moved away from the hope of the Gospel
- C. Apart from abiding, work will quickly dislodge you from the hope of the Gospel What are we building our house on? What foundation are we working from?

#### IV. 4 Invitations towards a well-seated firm base in Jesus:

## 1. Firsts and Lasts:

Make the first thing you see when you wake and the last thing you see before you sleep the Word of God

## 2. Consolations and Desolations:

Pour your heart out to Jesus- allow his Spirit to console you in the headaches and comfort you in the heartbreaks

#### 3. Recollection and Recalibration:

How proficient are you at the discipline of Rest? If rest is difficult, begin to explore why. Ask God to reveal some things and recalibrate your rhythms

## 4. Barnabus and Timothy:

Is there a Barnabas in your life- someone who's helping you look more like Jesus? Is there a Timothy- someone you can help be a disciple of Jesus. Who are you walking shoulder-to-shoulder with as you continue in the faith? Begin to ask God to show you who that might be.
